Stylish Silver Fox Boomerang Shawl Crochet Pattern Printable PDF

The Stylish Silver Fox Boomerang Shawl is a delicate and sophisticated crochet

pattern. Perfect for the transitioning months when you need a little something to layer up and look beautiful too.

This pattern is designed using a thread fine weight yarn that is self-striping. Making it a standout addition to any wardrobe. The pattern is great for using mini skeins and transitioning between colors effortlessly. It would look great using a wide variety of different colors.

Asymmetrical Design Crochet Boomerang Shawl

The shawl has all double crochet stitches and therefore works up very quickly. The pattern is designed to expand outwards in a boomerang-like fashion by using decreases and increases at the beginning and end of the rows. However, the growth of

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the asymmetrical design is on just one side.

Directions: Stylish Silver Fox Boomerang Shawl Crochet Pattern

34 inches wide at the widest point X 107 inches long

Changing the Size



You'll find that this shawl is quite long, if you prefer a crochet scarf pattern, just work less rows. The yarn cake that I used had over 1,000 yards. However, 600-1,000 yards would work nicely for this pattern. Since the shawl grows in width and length as you crochet the rows, you can stop when it gets to the length and width that you desire.

Gauge

14 stitches X 8 rows of double crochet stitches every 4 inches.

Materials

Twister from Hobbii, Color 02, which is a self-striping yarn: white to a grey to a black variegated yarn. 1 skein or 1093 yards.

Crochet Hook Size H 5.0mm

Yarn Needle

Scissors

Abbreviations

CH = Chain

CVS = Cluster V Stitch

DC = Double Crochet

DC CL = Double Crochet Cluster

SK = Skip

SL ST = Slip Stitch

SP = Space

ST = Stitch

STs = Stitches

YO = Yarn Over

[] = Repeat Between

Special Stitches



2 DC Cluster (2 DC CL). Essentially, you are working 2 double crochet stitches into one stitch and joining them together. Work the first DC yarning over the first two loops and not finishing that first DC yet. Instead, you yarn over again, insert the hook and yarn over and pull the loop through the stitch. Now you yarn over and pull through just 2 loops. There should be 3 loops remaining. Now yarn over one last time and pull through all three loops.

Here is another way of explaining the 2 DC Cluster.

- 1. YO, insert hook into a ST.
- 2. YO, pull the yarn through the ST (3 loops on hook)
- 3. YO and pull through the first 2 loops. (2 loops on hook)
- 4. YO, insert hook into same ST.
- 5. YO and pull the yarn through the ST (4 loops on hook)
- 6. YO and pull through the first 2 loops (3 loops on hook)
- 7. YO and pull the yarn through all remaining loops.

Cluster V Stitch (CVS). All in one stitch, work (2 DC CL, CH 1, 2 DC CL). When working in the CVS work into the CH 1 SP. You will always be skipping over the 2 DC CL and only working into the CH 1 SP.

Pattern Notes

The pattern is written in US terms.

All measurements given are unblocked.

CH 1 at the beginning of the rows does not count as a stitch.

CH 3 at the beginning of the rows counts as a DC.

The pattern is a repeat of rows 12 through 17.

The shawl starts at a point and expands on one side as you complete the rows. When you get to row 12, you will slip stitch in a few stitches to create a point on one side.

Turn at the end of each row.

Begin



CH 4

Row 1

Work 1 CVS in the 4th CH from the Hook. Turn (1 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 2

CH 1, CVS into the CH 1 SP of the previous row CVS, 3 DC into the top of the beginning CH 4. Turn (3 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 3

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC into the same ST. CH 1, SK 1 ST, DC in the next ST, CVS into the CH 1 SP of the previous row CVS. Turn (4 DC, 1 CH, 1 CVS)

Row 4

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the previous row CVS, DC in each ST across until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (7 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 5

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the previous row CVS. Turn (9 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 6

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the CVS. [DC into the next 3 STs, CH 1, SK 1 ST]. Repeat across between [] until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (10 DC, 1 CH, 1 CVS)

Row 7

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the CVS. Turn (13 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 8

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the CVS. DC in each ST across until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (15 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 9



CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the CVS. Turn (17 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 10

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the CVS. [DC into the next 3 STs, CH 1, SK 1 ST]. Repeat across between [] until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (16 DC, 1 CVS, 3 CH)

Row 11

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the CVS. Turn (21 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 12

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). SL ST into the first 2 DC CL, CH 1 SP, 2 DC CL, and the next 3 STs. (You should have done 6 SL STs). CH 1, CVS into the next ST. SK 1 ST. DC in each ST across until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (18 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 13

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the CVS. Turn (20 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 14

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the CVS. DC in each ST across until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (22 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 15

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. [CH 1, SK 1 ST, DC in the next 3 STs]. Repeat across between []. CVS into the CVS. Turn. (18 DC, 6 CH, 1 CVS)

Row 16

CH 1 (Doesn't count as a ST). CVS into the CVS. DC in each ST across until 2 STs remain, 2 DC in the next ST, 2 DC in the last ST. Turn (26 DC, 1 CVS)

Row 17

CH 3 (Counts as DC). 2 DC in the same ST. DC in each ST across to the CVS, CVS into the CVS. Turn (28 DC, 1 CVS)



Rows 18 through 162

Repeat rows 12 through 17.

Finishing

Weave in all yarn ends and remove excess yarn tails.
