Beginner-Friendly Easy Ribbed Pom Pom Scarf Crochet Pattern PDF

This Beginner-Friendly Easy Ribbed Pom Pom Scarf is a fun squishy and soft scarf that is simple to make. This crochet pattern is worked lengthwise and gives a soft, warm ladies scarf with plenty of gorgeous drape.

Use Any Yarn

Using basic stitches and simple techniques, you can use your favorite yarns. Even a chunky yarn or whatever type of yarn you have. Just measure the beginning chain stitches to make the scarf the length you desire. Keep adding rows for the width.

Skill Level

Gauge

I made this in two types of yarn.

Lion Brand Basic Stitch gauge 16 single crochet and 18 rows every 4 inches.

Yarnspirations Bernat Super Value gauge 13 single crochet and 16 rows every 4 inches.

Size

Mustard colored scarf: 4 ½ inches wide X 80 inches long.

White colored scarf: 4 ½ inches wide X 66 inches long.

Abbreviations

- CH = Chain
- SC BLO =Single Crochet Back Loop





- SL ST BLO = Slip Stitch Back Loop
- ST = Stitch
- STs = Stitches

Materials

Yarn. I used medium weight.

Lion Brand Basic Stitch. Mustard color, 2 skeins of yarn 185 yards each for a total of 370 yards.

Yarnspirations Bernat Super Value. White color, 1 partial skein of yarn 370 yards.

I used two different hook sizes. The mustard color scarf is worked in crochet hook size H 5.0 mm.

The white color scarf is worked using a crochet hook size I 5.5mm.

Measuring Tape

Tapestry Needle. If sewing on a Faux Fur Pom Pom, your needle should be able to fit through the holes.

Scissors

Faux Fur Pom Pom. I used the snap kind. If you use one with a loop, then you'll want a button for attaching the pom pom. If there is no loop, you can attach the pom pom with yarn.

You can make your own Yarn Pom Pom using a pom-pom maker or other method. Make it removable by placing a button on the inside of the top of the hat. Bring the yarn ends of the pom pom through the buttonholes and tie.

Pattern Notes

Written in US Terms.

Keep your slip stitches and your turning chain stitch loose. If they are too tight it is hard to get the crochet hook into the loop.



While this was made with a medium worsted weight yarn, you can make this with a different yarn weight. Just use a tape measure to check your length and width as you crochet your scarf.

Crochet Stitches

Single Crochet in the Back Bump of the Chain Stitch

Insert the hook in the back bump of the chain stitch, pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through the two loops on the hook.

Single Crochet Back Loop (SC BLO)

Insert the hook in the back loop, pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through the two loops on the hook.

Slip Stitch Back Loop (SL ST BLO)

Insert hook into back loop of stitch, yarn over, pull loop back through and through loop on hook.

Crochet Pattern

Start by making a slip knot and adding the loop on the hook.

Make a starting chain to the desired length you want for your scarf.

Mustard scarf work 260 foundation chain stitches.

White scarf work 100 foundation chain stitches.

Row 1

Beginning in the second chain from the hook, work 1 SC in the back bump each CH ST across to the end. Turn.

Row 2

CH 1. (Does not count as a ST). Work 1 SC into the back loop of each of the SC STs. Turn

Row 3 and Beyond

Repeat row 2 until the width is as wide as you desire.



Mustard scarf was 21 rows. White scarf was 18 rows.

Cut the yarn leaving a long tail, about 20 inches. Enough to sew the scarf ends and sew on the pom pom, if adding one.

Folding and Joining the Ends of the Scarf

Fold one end of the scarf in half, matching the edges.

Sew the end together with the yarn needle. I used the yarn needle and weaved the yarn back and forth through both layers on the end.

Adding Embellishments: The Finishing Touch

I added a faux fur pom pom that uses a snap to attach to the end of the crochet scarf. Switch to a yarn needle with an eye small enough to go through the holes of the snap. Sew the snap to the top outside of the scarf end you just sewed. Weave in the yarn ends and trim off the excess yarn. Snap on the pom pom.

Repeat this process for the other end of the scarf. Take care to fold the end of the scarf in the same direction as the first end.

Finishing

Weave in the ends with a tapestry needle. Cut off excess yarn.
